Experience of living with others

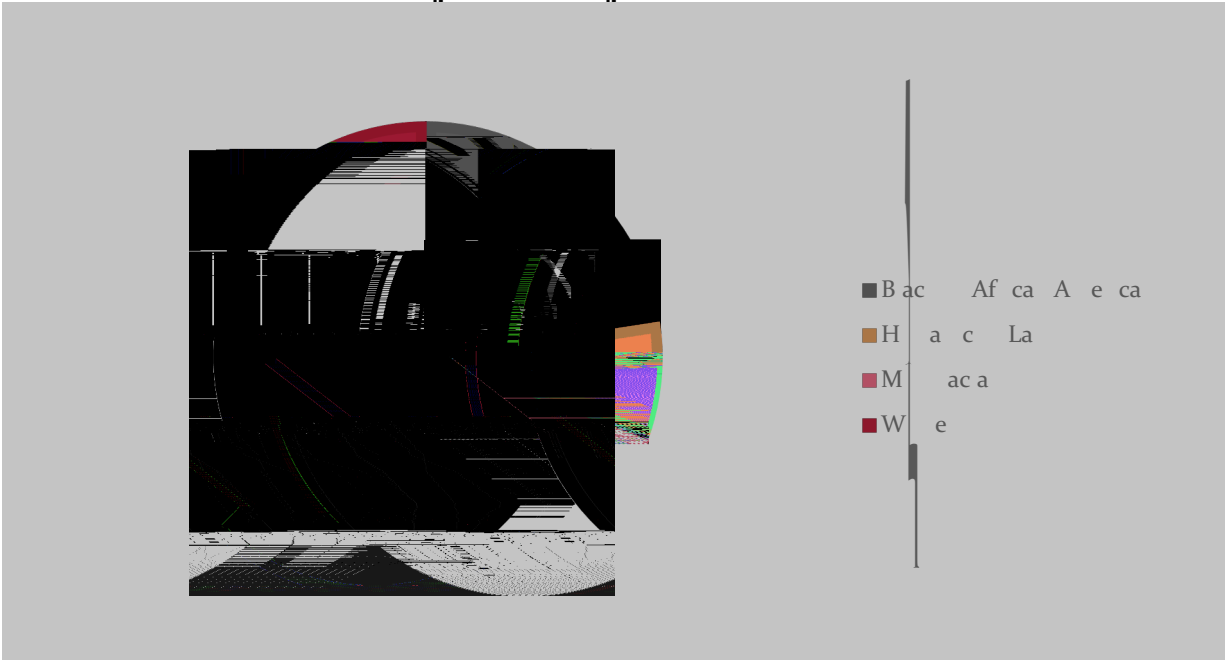
Acquisition of independence responsibility and
