IUP will receive \$17.1 million in funding for the Academy of Culinary Arts long-range facilities plan as part of the 2023-24 State System of Higher Education capital allocations budget. Speci cally, this funding will be used for the construction of the 45,000-squarefoot educational and multipurpose commercial facility in downtown Punxsutawney adjacent to the Academy's Fairman Centre. Design is underway for this Department of General Services project, which includes the demolition of properties gifted to IUP that are adjacent to the Fairman Centre.
