



THE FEDERAL CAMPUS SEXUAL ASSAULT VICTIMS BILL OF RIGHTS

The Campus Sexual Assault Victims' Bill of Rights is a federal law that requires all colleges and universities participating in federal student aid programs to protect sexual assault victims' certain basic rights:

- Survivors shall be notified of counseling services.
- Survivors shall be notified of options for changing class situations.
- Survivors shall be notified of their their options for law enforcement.
- Survivors shall be informed of the outcome of a disciplinary proceeding.
- Accuser and accused must have the same opportunity to have others present.
